GUIDE TO USING THE HIV/AIDS 101 DVD AND COMPANION SUMMARY

HOW TO USE THE MODULE 1: DVD

The DVD is approximately 60-minutes long and is structured by sections called Chapters. Each chapter addresses a specific topic related to HIV. The DVD can be paused at any time for educator review or class discussion.

HOW TO USE THE AUXILIARY MODULES: MODULE 2 AND MODULE 3

For groups that desire additional or more detailed content, the Florida Department of Health has created supplemental education modules that expand the content delivered by the DVD. These modules are comprised of a series of downloadable PDF files for instructor use. The Module 1 DVD provides pausing points throughout the program where you will be prompted by the narrator to pause the video if using any of the Module 2 or Module 3 materials. For professions or other class environments where more than one-hour of continuing education is required, Module 2 and/or Module 3 can be used to supplement your curriculum at your discretion.
